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WELCOME / MEETING OVERVIEW

David Shackley, Board Chair, welcomed the Board and shared his excitement for the upcoming trials. He asked that the Board members continue to promote the Foundation and introduce prospects.

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- Tim Hinchey, President & CEO of USA Swimming and the USA Swimming Foundation, recognized and thanked the USA Swimming Foundation staff for their work during Elaine's leave. Mr. Hinchey noted an increase in attendance at Foundation events as a testament to the Board's efforts. Mr. Hinchey echoed Mr. Shackley's excitement around U.S. Olympic Team Trials Swimming ("Trials"). Mr. Hinchey shared updates on planned activations and promotions in collaboration with Indiana Sports Corp. Mr. Hinchey also noted upcoming meets leading up to Trials and highlighted the meet locations chosen to impact

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Mr. Hinchey closed with a reminder on the ticket options available at Trials, emphasizing the opportunity to steward and prospect donors at USA Swimming's biggest event in the quad.

51	Michelle Steinfeld, Secretary and General Counsel, reported on updates to the nominating process for
52	the upcoming Board member appointments, which will allow more flexibility for the Nominating
53 54	Committee to identify and interview prospective Board members.
55	MOTION: To approve the 2024 Foundation Board Charge to the Nominating Committee as follows:
56	The Board is looking for a candidate with the time and expertise to dedicate to USA Swimming. To
57	supplement the qualifications that constitute an "ideal candidate" set forth in Foundation Board
58	Governing Policy 2.9, the Board has identified the additional criteria:
59	 A strong relationship with U.S. Masters Swimming;
60	• Connections to LA2028, preferably through living in Southern California or through professional
61	or personal networks; or
62	 Candidates from the <u>Central Zone</u> or Texas to promote geographic diversity on the Board.
63	There is no expectation that a candidate must meet any or all of the above specified criteria.
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65	Discussion regarding the criteria set forth ensued.

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69	FINANCE / INVESTMENT REPORTS:
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71	Eric Skufca, Chief Financial Officer, reviewed the 2023 financial reports and provided the current 2024
72	financial projections. Jay Definis, Treasurer, highlighted that increased fundraising efforts and favorable
73	market conditions have made a positive impact to the organization's balance sheet and income
74	statement. Mr. Skufca provided additional context around both current year and multi-year/long term,
75	"pipeline" fundraising and spoke to the long-term investment portfolio performance and activity.
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77	Andrew Wilson inquired about increased interest in sponsorships and major gifts in advance of the
78	Olympics. Mr. Hinchey highlighted that overall, the organization is seeing more interest and engagement
79	as the quad concludes with the Olympics.
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81	Elaine Calip, Executive Director, Foundation, expressed optimism as Trials will create more opportunities

to engage new audiences. Mrs. Calip explained that major gifts can fluctuate due to timing, but gifts can

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be more consistent with a healthy pipeline.

DONOR ATHLETE PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM (DAPP)

Tom Luchsinger, Director, Development, thanked Stacy Michael-Miller, Director, National Team Support & Services, and Lindsay Mintenko, Managing Director, National Team for their partnership. Mr. Luchsinger reported changes to the timeline, eligibility criteria, and contribution minimums for DAPP donors.

Jill Bornstein asked about the changes to identifying financial need. Mr. Luchsinger responded that if the number of eligible athlete applications exceeds available donors, selection will be based on demonstrated financial need. Mrs. Calip shared that this program has grown exponentially, and these changes were implemented to ensure continued success.

LEARN TO SWIM GRANTS

Karin Olmsted, Director, Member Success, reported on Learn to Swim Grants progress from 2023 and 2024. Ms. Olmstead shared that the Foundation will be donating \$650,000 for Youth Learn to Swim Grants, \$130,000 for Adult Learn to Swim Grants, and \$50,000 in vouchers to a pilot program in Boston.

Mrs. Calip informed the group that Value-In-Kind (VIK) has historically been used to support the mission and this year the Foundation will be utilizing VIK to fulfill equipment requests from the Learn to Swim grant applicants.

U.S. MASTERS UPDATE

Dawson Hughes, CEO of U.S. Masters Swimming (USMS), presented information about Grown up Swimming. Mr. Hughes shared that Natalie Hinds will be a guest on the Master's Plus webinar, which serves as a benefit of an upgraded USMS membership. Mr. Hughes plans to continue offering the upgraded membership to continue supporting the Foundation.

Mr. Hughes reported an emphasis on USMS Spring Nationals in Indianapolis. In collaboration with the Foundation, USMS is promoting the Swim in the Trials pool scheduled for Sunday, June 23.

Mr. Hughes presented on USMS engagement, including recent acquisition of Grown-up Swimming, which has increased from seven markets to over twenty markets this summer. Mr. Hughes shared further updates on College Club Swimming, LaneMate, stroke analysis, and other resources to engage and expand the masters community.

Greg Pinchbeck inquired about the future of Masters Open Water swimming. Mr. Hughes discussed the challenges that open water presents and how they are looking to USA Swimming staff for more assistance and expertise.

OLYMPIC TEAM SELECTION UPDATE

Mrs. Mintenko briefed the Board on the selection process of the 2024 Olympic Team. Mrs. Mintenko shared with the Board that the team roster will be announced on June 23.

155	the sport.

158	Olympic Team.

162	marketing campaign to encourage participation in the sport at all levels. Mr. Hinchey emphasized the
