

Greetings from Colorado Springs -

2023 was an incredible year for the USA Swimming Foundation, a success made possible by the steadfast and loyal support of our valued donors and constituents, including U.S. Masters Swimming, our amazing charitable partners, our Champions Club members, and anyone who took the time to learn more about the programs we support. We only make strides towards our mission of Saving Lives, Building Champions, and Impacting Communities with the unwavering dedication of the entire swimming community.

We are proud to report that in 2023, the Foundation awarded over \$800,000 in learn-to-swim grants to programs nationwide. These grants reached 125 youth and adult providers across 33 states, bringing the total grant funding provided by the Foundation since its inception to over \$8 million. The 2023 grant cycle impacted the lives of over 14,000 individuals.

In addition, we dedicated over \$1.2 million to support our National Team athletes as they inspired us all with jaw-dropping performances at meets across the globe. These dollars went to travel, training, recovery, and mental health resources. Specifically, our Donor Athlete Partnership Program (DAPP) supported 32 athletes by offering them financial resources and mentorship to create continued success in and out of the pool.

Lastly, the USA Swimming Foundation continued to expand the reach of programs designed to develop competitive opportunities for traditionally underserved communities. In 2023, the Foundation awarded \$210,000 to 29 programs through Community Impact Grants and eight HBCU grants, thanks in part to the support of our partners at OneAmerica Financial. We also fueled \$108,500 into Regional Coaches' Clinics and camps specifically designed for diverse members of our sport.

The 2024 U.S. Olympic Team Trials—Swimming presented by Lilly provided the perfect stage to showcase the Foundation's 20 years of service. We hope you were able to join us. Thank you for continuing to advocate for better access and opportunity to our sport.


