What is OTS? The Officials Tracking System (OTS) is a part of the SWIMS database used for recording USA Swimming Officials' requirements and history. OTS allows for USA Swimming Officials to track the sessions they have worked, evaluations, etc. to maintain their existing certification and pursue higher levels of certification if they so choose. This is a critical tool in the professional development of USA Swimming Officials to serve our sport.
