# Not all Official Committees are created equally

- Typically, LSC Officials Committee duties include:
  - Certification and recertification
  - On-deck mentoring
  - Preparing for OQMs
  - Assignments or suggestions of officials for championship meets
  - Budgeting
  - Succession planning

- Using OTS for officials' skill development and progression

  - N2 and N3 Evaluations and Certifications



# OQMs: Who, what, how?

- LSC Officials Committee Chairs are responsible for submitting the Official Qualifying Meet (OQM) request form to the NOC for approval
  - This includes any Sectional/Zone meets hosted in your LSC.
- Things to consider before applying
- Application
- OQM Task force (Marianne Walling) will respond with issues, questions, and/or approval



# N2 Mentors & Evaluators in your LSC

- LSC OCs are responsible for developing N2 Evaluators in your LSC
- Evaluator appointment guidelines
- Evaluations &Training (Trish Martin)



# Nominating N3 Mentors & Evaluators

- LSC OCs are in charge of nominating N3i and N3f evaluators to the NOC
- Nominations are reviewed once per quarter, but you can nominate at any time
- Evaluator appointment guidelines

# Official Excellence Award Nominations

- LSC OCs are responsible for nominations for Officials Excellent Award

# Quarterly Calls

- Attend LSC OC quarterly calls hosted by the NOC
- Usually, the first Wednesday of each quarter (January, April, July, & October) unless that falls on a Holiday
- Webinars, important information, and Q & A sessions are all part of the calls

## LSC OC Best Practices

- Plan a "SwimPosium" for your officials or add official sessions to your SwimPosium
- Hold a "Zoom" seminar at the beginning of each season to go over new rules, procedures, and general 'state of the LSC'
- Succession planning: Have you trained your replacement? More than one?
- Monthly "To Do" Lists
- Monthly topics to be covered in emails/newsletters



# LSC OC Best Practices

- Championship meet planning for MRs and ARs: Learn from the process for national meets
- How are you and your committee going to grow members of referees, starters, & administrative officials?
- How are Meet Referees, Admin Referees, Team Leads and officials chosen for your LSC-sponsored meets?



# LSC OC Best Practices

- Does you LSC actively participate and support National Officials Certification?
- Does your LSC sponsor officials attending National level meets? Do you have a budget?
- How are you communicating with your officials in your LSC New rules, applications to officiate, opportunities to expand skills
- Offer officiating seminars Meet Referee Best Practices, Administrative Referee Best Practices, Chief Judge at a Championship meet, etc.
- Crucial Conversations don't let inappropriate situations continue repetitively or bad situations fester



# LSC and Your Zone

- Who is your Zone's Official Chair introduce yourself to them

- Each Zone is different!
- In general, the Zone OC selects the Meet Referee, Admin Referee, and potentially the TLCJ for Sectional and Zone Meets
  - They may ask your input as to who is ready to take on these roles from your LSC.
