Meeting Packet

- 1. Legislative items will be considered in block order.
- 2. Sections A, B, and C will be considered as omnibus motions, except for those items pulled for discussion. Within the block, delegates will be given the opportunity to pull items.

- 4. Items pulled will be considered in numerical order after the respective omnibus motion.
- 5. Omnibus motions are in the affirmative as motions to approve the block of items.
- 6. Other motions should generally be stated in the affirmative.
- 7. Any amendment requires simple majority for approval. The subsequently amended main motion will require the original percentage (e.g., majority, 2/3 or 90%). An entirely new item will require 90% for adoption.
- 8. If you wish to speak to an item, please reference the attached LUMI Global instructions. Anonymous requests will not be recognized. Please use the following action items for commonly used Robert's Rules actions:
 - PULL (and the item number) = pull an item
 - PRO = speak for a motion
 - CON = speak against a motion
 - AMEND = make an amendment
 - CALL = move the previous question
 - POINT = point of order
 - INFORMATION = point of information
 - INQUIRY = point of parliamentary inquiry

Disability is defined as a permanent physical or cognitive disability that substantially limits one or more major life activities. - .1 Authority — The USA Swimming Rules & Regulations grant the Referee authority to modify any rule or race management procedure for a swimmer with a disability. Any such modification shall affect only the current event and does not set precedent.

- INTRODUCTION USA Swimming was organized as the National Governing Body for the sport of swimming under the 13.1 Amateur Sports Act of 1978, as amended by the Ted Stevens Olympic and Amateur Sports Act of 1998, both federal laws. These laws require USA Swimming to establish and maintain provisions for the swift and equitable resolution of all disputes involving any of its members. This Article, together with Section 2.2 and the National Board of Review procedures, pursuant to Policy 26.0 of the USA Swimming Operating Policy Manual, are intended to provide a mechanism for resolving in an orderly and fair way all manner and kinds of disputes that may arise among its members in connection with the sport of swimming. Accordingly, XXSI has established the Administrative Review Board to hear complaints and appeals regarding

administrative matters within XXSI which do not rise to the level of Code of Conduct violations and are not appeals of sanction decisions. The Administrative Review Board shall have no jurisdiction to hear complaints regarding conduct that may violate the USA Swimming Code of Conduct or otherwise violate the policies, procedures, rules and regulations adopted by USA Swimming, or conduct that may bring USA Swimming, XXSI or the sport of swimming into disrepute.
